

WARMUP PROBLEM GUIDELINES

Work on all the Warmup Problems (WP), and write up a solution. You should work on each problem first by yourself, but may continue the work by discussing it with others. Then write up your solution, without looking at any other student's written solution. Indicate where there are gaps, if any, in your reasoning, and briefly what you've thought about to fill them. If you are completely stumped, get help from classmates and/or instructors. If you are still completely stumped when it's almost time for class, write down some of your brainstorming.

WP solutions are due at the start of class, no later than 12:30 pm. They should be submitted through Canvas, preferably as a single file. If you are not yet enrolled in the class, they may be submitted as an attached file by email to the TA, Josh Southerland, jsouther@uw.edu.

Then bring a hard copy of your Warmup Problem solutions to class. You will compare solutions in small groups, and may be asked to write the solution up on the board for the class to discuss.

If it is impossible for you to submit your WP solutions electronically, bring two hard copies to class, and be sure to hand in one before class starts. Put it in the envelope marked "WP if not submitted to Canvas" that will be at the front of the classroom.

Each set of will be graded on a 0 to 2 scale. You will get 2 points if you turn in a solution or a serious attempt at a solution on all the problems.
