Text: Precalculus, A First Course In Problem Solving, by D.H. Collingwood, K.D. Prince, and M. M. Conroy. Printed copies maybe available at the University Bookstore. It is also freely available electronically via the class website, and electronically linked through WebAssign.

Homework: Homework will be assigned, collected and graded through Webassign. You will be able to receive feedback on problems that you have submitted and you will be allowed to resubmit (most of) your homework problems up to five times. True or False questions or other similar questions allow only one submission. I will drop your worst week homework score. I expect the homework to take considerable time and effort; therefore you are strongly encouraged to start your homework early.

Course material: This course designed to prepare you for succeeding in Calculus. **Course organization:** You will have lectures, where new material is presented, on MWF. On Tuesdays and Thursdays you will meet with a Teaching Assistant in a smaller group. In quiz section you will be able to ask questions about the homework and review material.

On many Tuesdays you will have a worksheet. At the end of the class your TA will give you one of three possible scores: 0 (if you did nothing or did not hand in a worksheet), 1 (if you arrived late, left early or did very little), or 2 (if you clearly made an honest effort to complete the worksheet). There will be no makeup worksheets, but I will drop your lowest worksheet score, so you will be able to miss on Tuesday quiz section with no penalties.

Exams: exam dates are posted on the class Web page. Please note that the common 120 final will be on the Saturday <u>before</u> finals week.
