

How to Get Help on HW and Old Exams

First, keep an organized notebook and practice writing out your work in doing problems.

Second, let yourself struggle before seeking out help.

Third, always check your work and practice getting things right on the FIRST attempt.

Now, if you are still stuck on a problem here are resources you should be using/trying...

1. Watch lecture videos!
2. Read textbook.
3. Ask questions in quiz section. Or TA or instructor Zoom office hours.
4. Use our Canvas discussion board. You typically will get a response within a few hours.
5. Use the MSC discussion board, live tutors are on to help you and you typically will get a response immediately:
